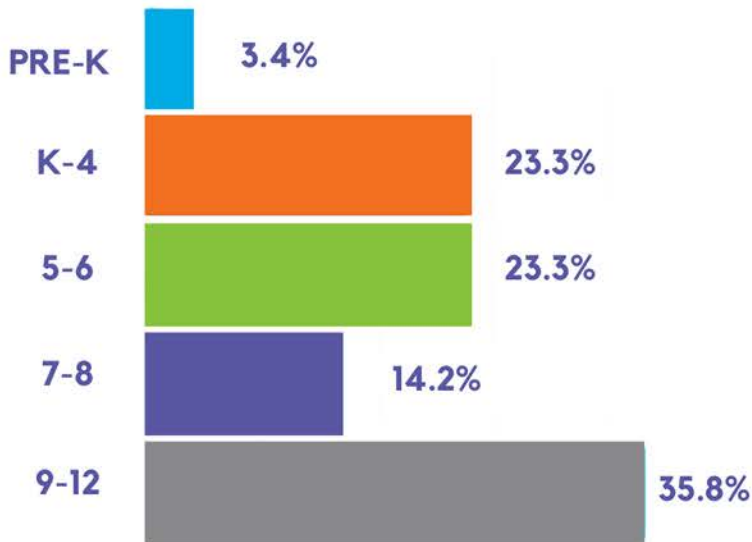

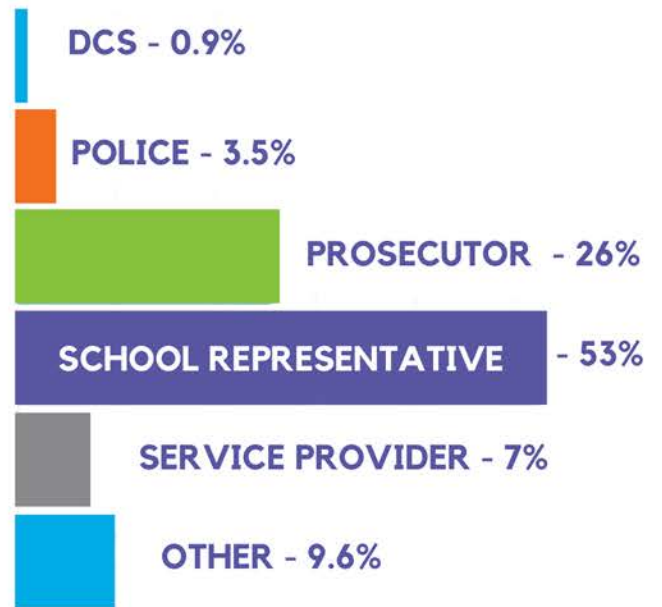

MENTORING & TUTORING

Provide identified youth with a meaningful experience from a caring, trusted adult. Its primary goal is to guide our youth towards establishing a stronger connection within the community through a positive relationship with their mentor/tutor.

General counseling, anger management, and other mental health resources are provided for students through local partnerships with counselors, licensed mental health practitioners, physicians and other community-based resources.

WYAP recognizes the importance of connecting our youth and families with mental health services and other professional services to work through the obstacles of life such as divorce, separation, grief and loss, domestic violence, raising grandchildren, parenting, alternative education, addiction, etc. These are all tough challenges for our youth.

This year, we were able to provide hundreds of our youth who were uninsured or underinsured with a total of:

HOLIDAY GIVING

WYAP board members and staff came to help, along with many of the Community First Bank staff. We also had a mentor and mentee who were so excited to share their experience! We were excited to raise over \$1,130 thanks to the generosity of our community.



A NEW SHOE DAY

Thanks to the connection of one of our Board Members, WYAP was able to provide 104 youth with a pair of shoes at the start of the new school year. We were so grateful for this connection and know that all of our youth were so excited for their new pair of shoes, allowing the youth to start off the school year on the right foot.

MARKETING, PUBLIC RELATIONS & EVENTS

We strive to develop and implement public relations strategies & campaigns within the community to market WYAP and increase its visibility. We were fortunate this year to have many opportunities to market our program to the community.

Youth Recognition Breakfast

Our 13th annual Youth Recognition Breakfast, held May 10th at IMMI Conference Center, honored 19 students who have overcome adversity, demonstrated positive change, or made a positive academic turnaround. The recipients ranged from first through twelfth grade.

The student honorees received a brief presentation that highlighted their accomplishments and a special greeting from Blue, the Indianapolis Colts' mascot. They also received a framed photo with special messages for them.

At the event, WYAP awarded our first two scholarships to two seniors at Westfield High School. One scholarship was in honor of Christine Brown for \$5,002 to honor the 502 youth she worked with. The other, the WYAP scholarship, was for \$1,000 and was presented to a former WYAP youth.

GIVING TUESDAY

Our Giving Tuesday campaign on November 28th was a huge success. We were so grateful for our two anonymous donors **who matched up to \$7,000 in funds**, to double our donations for a total of \$17,748, surpassing our \$15k goal!
